A) Books, literature and reading

Reading books – one of the favourite leisure time activities. Books accompany people everywhere: we read them while travelling to school/work, waiting for a consultation with our GP, during breaks at school, on holiday. We can't imagine our lives without books. Reading gives people lot of pleasure, give a chance to learn about the world around us, give a lot of information and advice, can entertain, are amusing, and are about other people's experience. It's a great hobby, which gives people the opportunity to learn something new and improve their communication skills. It also challenges their imagination and brings pleasure to their lives. Those who are keen on reading can choose from a wide variety of books. Reading as a hobby – you can <u>buy a book in a bookshop, borrow it from a library</u> – they charge a small fee for yearly membership or for each book borrowed. If you want to borrow books from a library, you should get <u>a library card</u>. You can also borrow a book from a friend who is keen on reading to recommend a good book or you can check the <u>book reviews</u> in newspaper.

Literature – 2 categories:

- $\frac{\text{non-fiction}}{\text{or}} \rightarrow \text{for information: textbooks (educational books), dictionaries,} \\ \text{encyclopaedias , biographies, autobiographies, memoirs, self-help books,} \\ \text{travel/history/art books, cookery books}$
- and <u>fiction books</u> \rightarrow about imaginary people or events
 - →<u>poetry</u>: poems
 - \rightarrow <u>prose</u>: tales, short stories, novellas, romances, crime/spy novels, mysteries, science fiction, westerns, thrillers, historical novels

<u>Story</u> can be set in a real or imaginary <u>place/time</u> in which the <u>characters</u> live. The <u>plot</u> can be narrated by the <u>author</u> or by one of the characters.

Every year, the Nobel Prize for Literature is awarded to the writer whose work is considered to be a unique achievement.

Some useful expressions: concentrate/focus on, describe/description, the story is set in the time of..., it is set in/placed, develop the love motif, simple/complicated plot, surprising turn at the end, happy/tragic/open/unexpected ending
